Since 1999, the Cubihatcha Outdoor Education Center has catered to visitors' outdoor interests by providing a venue for exploration and learning within nature.

Cubihatcha consists of 1,000 acres of land situated between two of the five drinking water reservoirs in Henry County. Visitors are invited to walk 10 miles on our three beautiful nature trails.

School groups and special event amenities include fishing and educational programs. Other visitor amenities include hiking, picnicking in one of the ten covered pavilions and bird watching opportunities

CONSERVATION FACTS

- Henry County Water Authority owns and manages more than 3,800 acres of mitigated property
- Over 2,500 acres in the surrounding area are protected, restored, and enhanced for perpetual use
- 450 plus Wood Duck boxes have been installed in an effort to replace disturbed habitat
- 75,000 plus native species of trees have been planted to help restore wetlands and forests
- Each year more than 3,700 youth visit Cubihatcha for an educational experience outdoors






In order to preserve the quality of our water reservoirs, please remain on the trails and follow posted rules:

The Rowland (Long Branch) Reservoir has a raw water storage capacity of approximately 4,600 acre-feet or 1.5 billion gallons. It is one of 5 drinking water reservoirs operated by the HCWA



PRESERVE.

In all, the HCWA is responsible for obtaining and preserving more than 8,500 acres of green space in the form of reservoirs, buffers, wetlands, forested spray fields, and related properties, which will be forever protected from development
